

# ANPD'S REGULATORY AGENDA FOR THE YEARS 2021 AND 2022

Although Brazil's General Data Protection Law (LGPD) is already in force, there are still some points pending regulation by Brazil's Data Protection Authority (Autoridade Nacional de Proteção de Dados – "ANPD").

Yesterday, Ordinance No. 11 of January 27, 2021, was published, in which the ANPD released its schedule of activities to begin the LGPD's regulation processes, covering the 2021-2022 biennium. The agenda presents a plan based on three phases, which took into account the level of prioritization of each topic to be regulated by the Authority.

Thus, for the activities included in the first phase, the forecast for the start of regulatory processes will take place within one year, while those of the second phase should take place within a year and six months, and finally, the third phase, for which initiatives will take place within a maximum period of two years.

Check below the topics that will be regulated in each phase:

## Phase 1

- ANPD's Internal Regulation;
- ANPD's strategic planning;
- Data protection and privacy of small and medium-sized companies, startups and individuals who process personal data for economic purposes;
- Establishment of regulations for the application of Article 52 and following of the LGPD;
- Reporting of incidents and specification of the notification deadline;
- Data Protection Impact Assessment.

## Phase 2

- Data Protection Officer (DPO);
- International transfer of personal data.

## Phase 3

- Rights of personal data subjects;
- Lawful basis for the processing of personal data.
